
WATER VOLE SPOTTED

VILLAGE HALL GRANT SUCCESS SPURS DEVELOPMENT

NVH has received an award for £27,594 from WREN (Waste Recycling Environment Ltd.) supported by £2,966 from Sober Hill Wind Farm Fund. We can go ahead with PHASE 1 (new toilets, disabled and baby changing toilet, new heating system, a security system, coffee area and new front door!) – all refurbishments vital to make NVH accessible to all. Works will start 8 January 2018 and last 8-10 weeks. Every effort will be made to minimise disruption to users – the main hall and kitchen will be open as usual, with portaloos provided outside.

We are pleased to announce the formation of 'FRIENDS OF NEWBALD VILLAGE HALL' – this is your chance to support NVH by providing your name/ contact details to offer your help - volunteering – such as manning the door at events, help serving on the bar etc..
