## NPC STEPS UP SUPERFAST BROADBAND CAMPAIGN

Graham Stuart MP visited Newbald on 14<sup>th</sup> July to meet with Councillors and residents who currently have no prospect of being able to access superfast broadband because of a lack of infrastructure. A representative from KCOM was also



present. He committed KCOM to making a commercial decision in respect of the excluded roads within the next few weeks. This will either allow the work to go ahead or free these roads up for alternative supplier and public funding options. ## WATER VOLES LOST TO SPILL

NPC was very saddened by the death of several water voles, which was the result of diesel finding its way into the beck. The oil spill came from a tractor. The diesel was on the road but heavy rain washed it into the beck. NPC consulted with the Environment Agency (EA) and the Yorkshire Wildlife Trust (YWT) to determine the best way forward. The EA considers the spill to be 'insignificant' in terms of potential damage to the

environment. This is not an opinion shared by NPC. The EA did do some work to limit further damage by putting absorbent pads in the beck.

It will be Spring before we know whether there will be long term harm to the water vole population. If there is, NPC may look at working with the YWT to bring in water voles from another area. This would be sensitive and costly work which it would have to fund raise and find volunteers for.

## COMMUNITY LED HOUSING

Do you feel strongly that Newbald should have more affordable housing? Do you know young people who can't afford to live here or older people who can't downsize? If so, you may be interested in a new fund called the Community Housing Fund. East Riding of Yorkshire Council is promoting the fund, which aims to provide funding for small affordable housing developments in rural communities. The idea is that the local community plays a significant part in identifying any needs and the types of housing required. The community group then goes on to develop ideas, potential designs and layouts and ultimately works with experts to deliver a scheme.
