The winners will be announced at the start of the Autumn term. The best posters from each age bracket will be reproduced and displayed around the village to help raise awareness and remind those responsible of how anti-social and dangerous it is not to pick up dog faeces.

EXCITING TIMES AT THE VILLAGE HALL

NEWBALD VILLAGE HALL has done it again! Your hall has been given funding from the Big Lottery to refurbish the kitchen! The £9,000+ will provide new units and a dishwasher. We have applied to Tesco Bags for Life for funding to provide electrical equipment for the bar area, and are awaiting their decision. This will bring the kitchen up-to-date with the lobby and toilets recently refurbished. We will have to find funding for the extras such as wall re-plastering and tiling, and the flooring, but it is on its way! Phase 2 (new meeting room office and storage area) is a far bigger and costly project - over £130,000. We have been applying to various funders and are awaiting their decisions. The more money you ask for the more the competition for a smaller pool of funds, and the more work you have to put into the application. So far we have managed to get through the initial stages but have no definite decisions yet ... but there is hope and we have not been rejected. This is a slow burn so please bear with us.

Your support is invaluable - at events, by subscribing to Newbald 100 Club, and by using the hall - all this helps make NVH sustainable.

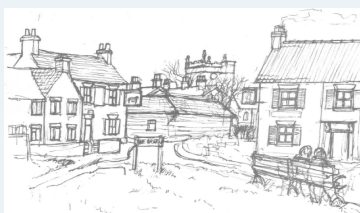
