BUILDING OF REMEMBRANCE

NPC is pleased to announce that from the New Year, you will be able to display plaques dedicated to your loved ones on the walls of the historic building at the back of the cemetery. The building has recently been refurbished. NPC has determined what size the plaques should be, but otherwise relatives are free to choose materials, design and (non offensive) wording. Relatives can arrange for the plaque to be made by a supplier of their choice. NPC will charge a one-off fee of £100 to display the plaque, which will also include installation.

In this day and age, less and less people are choosing burial and this is an alternative way of providing an all important memorial to a loved one.
