The meeting room, storage, office and new entrance are well on target thanks to the builders' hard work and the brilliant weather, and we should be finished by the end of July. The initial funding from R B Massey Memorial Trust, Newbald Parish Council, and LEADER has enabled us to construct the new extensions, but this funding did not cover the finishing off costs. In March we heard from the Bernard Sunley Foundation that we have been awarded £10000!
