Newbald Parish Council was sorry to lose Cllr. Becky Clarke after she resigned for personal reasons. Members would like to thank her for her enthusiasm, engagement and help over the last few years.

We would also like to welcome Diana Stewart to the fold.

Diana has been resident in Newbald since 1982 and thoroughly enjoys living in such a go-ahead village. Through the years she has been involved with the Playgroup, the School and St Nicholas' Church. Latterly, she and her husband, Hamish, have been instrumental in setting up 'Apple Day', which takes place each October. They make apple juice from local apples to help support the Newbald Young People's Project.

Since her retirement from district nursing, Diana has found that she has more time and felt she would like to join the Parish Council to be part of the team, resolve villagers' issues and to further help Newbald to flourish.

PROJECTS IN THE PIPELINE

NPC is constantly looking for ways in which it can improve recently restored the bench cemetery building and gates, next year we are considering replacing the cemetery wire fence, replacing more village benches with recycled plastic ones and offering to restore the Church Rooms' doors. Newbald Parish Council (NPC) has applied for and secured two grants which have enabled us to start two projects, both of which will help protect the environment, whilst also enhancing the village. The first grant was from the East Riding Year of Green Action Fund for a Bee Paradise on Co-op corner (corner of Galegate and Eastgate). We purchased two large hexagonal planters and a bench, all made from hard wearing maintenance-free recycled plastic. Children from Newbald Primary School learned about the importance of bees, determined what plants the bees would like in the different seasons and worked with Councillor Beccy O'Sullivan to plant a wide variety in the planters. In so doing, they have created a special area purposely to attract and feed bees. Bees are vital to a healthy environment and healthy economy. They are the world's most important pollinator of food crops. One third of the food that we consume each day relies on pollination

mainly by bees. Without bees, we may lose all the plants that bees pollinate, all of the animals that eat those plants and so on up the food chain. According to the report 'Bees Under Siege' (WWF and Buglife), many species of bee are on the brink of extinction in parts of the UK and some types have been lost entirely. Habit loss is cited as one reason for this.

NPC knows that the environment is increasingly important to our residents. Many have also long called for something to be done to improve Co-op the look of the village. Having corner. 

PHASE 3

After having a structural survey done of Newbald Village Hall we realised that within the next year we will have to give serious consideration to the exterior fabric of the main hall. The roof covering has a life expectancy of 17 years and to our knowledge it has not been touched since the hall was built in 1970s. The exterior walls are showing signs of decay (namely fungus within the walls!) in spite of repeated repairs. All this would require considerable funding, which can take quite some time to

establish, so we have started considering PHASE 3 now. PHASE 3 also could consider a possible extension to incorporate a bar and storage alongside the main hall (area shown in red on the drawing). The bar has proved a valuable revenue source for the hall and can be compromised being run from the kitchen. A dedicated bar would ensure a sustainable income to give a secure financial base for Newbald Village Hall.

It is vital for us and our potential funders to know what Newbald residents think and whether this is the best way to go. We will be canvassing for your opinion over the next few months but please feel free at any time to voice your concerns, advice, opinions on our facebook page or directly to any committee member. On 25th January, we are holding an event to launch the completed Phase 2 work, thank everyone involved and give you the chance to learn more about our proposals for the next stage... 
